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

Haircuts/styles

I make reference to comments in the Student Diary with regards student haircuts/styles. In particular, you would be aware that the College has a conservative hair policy. When a student wears the College uniform in public, their personal appearance reflects upon the whole College community. For this reason, the College reserves the right to determine what it feels is an appropriate haircut/style. As a general guide coloured, streaked or extreme hairstyles are not permitted. Further, undercuts, layers and blade cuts less than a blade three are not acceptable. There should be a blending/grading between the side and the top of the hair.

For some students there can be a tendency over the school holidays to get a haircut that does not comply with College expectations. In some cases though, there is not always the time for the hair to grow back in order to meet College expectations.
