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### Adopting a Growth Mindset

Put simply a growth mindset is the belief that intelligence can be developed. At WestMAC we encourage our students to adopt a growth mindset because this will assist them to understand they can increase their ability in a subject through hard work, the use of effective strategies, and by seeking help from others when needed. Someone who has a fixed mindset believes intelligence is a fixed trait that is set in stone at birth.

Students' beliefs about intelligence have important consequences for how they experience school and respond to adversity. A student who has a fixed mindset can find school threatening because they are worried about proving their ability. This can lead to the student avoiding challenges and giving up too soon. On the other hand, a student with a growth mindset can see school as an opportunity for growth and embraces challenges in order to develop mastery.

Daily interactions parents and teachers have with students can create a mindset which can either support or undermine resilience. A simple strategy adults can use is praising the process students have undertaken as opposed to ability or the final outcome. For example: "You are good at Maths; you got an A on your last test" very much focuses on the ability of the student. Alternatively, "You really studied for your Maths test and your improvement shows it" praises the process and develops a growth mindset and promotes resilience.

As you read your son or daughter's Term 1 Report card, I and the other Heads of School encourage you to be mindful of the effort and process your child or children have put in this term; and offer praise accordingly.

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As the Middle School comes to the end of a very busy term, our expectation is that students end the way they started, by focusing on the importance of establishing and maintaining positive relationships. Importantly, this focus shouldn't be seen as simply a reflection of influential people in their lives, but also an opportunity for each student to examine their own values, attitudes and beliefs.

In the Positive Relationships incursion this week, students were encouraged (and often challenged) to move beyond their comfort zone in examining their own identity and relationships across multiple contexts. Brett Lee, an ex-police detective in child safety and an internet and cyber-safety expert, provided a very honest account of digital footprints and the impact of social media on student's profiles and relationships. Additionally, students engaged in various workshops including exploring emotional and physical control and strategies to maintain their health and emotional wellbeing. Equally important, workshops catered for faith and physical exercise, each playing a vital part in a balanced and positive self. At the end of the day, each student participated in a reflection, developing an action plan that highlights not only information learnt from the day, but also a document that they will open at a later date and reflect on their success of maintaining their own principles of maintaining positivity in their life.

It is my hope that although the incursion is only one day in length, the lessons learnt from this incursion will help build a positive environment for the Middle School across the years. In partnership with you, I hope that this day provides opportunities for your family and friends to discuss the importance of self-reflection and developing positive strategies in our busy everyday lives.

With this in mind, I encourage you to attend Brett Lee's parent presentation on Wednesday 9 May. Further information

regarding the time and venue will be provided early next term. This will be an excellent opportunity for you to engage in up-to-date information regarding cyber safety and engaging in strategies to ensure positive online behaviour. 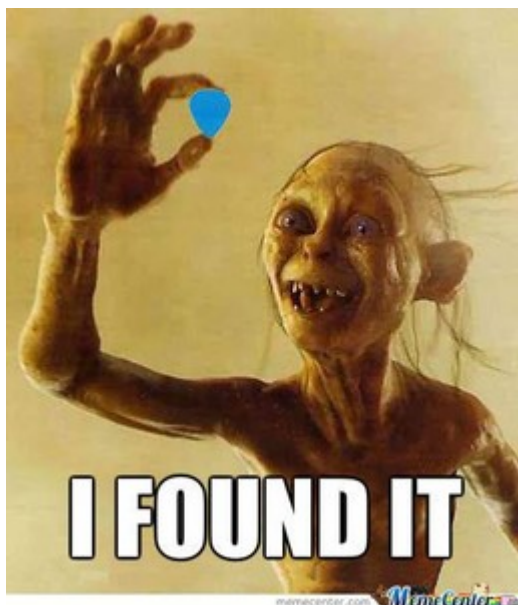
