SEQ Futsal Championships

Our U14 Girls came up against last year's champions, Brigidine College and following a tense battle the game ended in a draw. Unfortunately Brigidine were ranked higher, which meant the girls' day was over prematurely. On a positive note, the majority of the U16 Girls team were aged 15 or under which bodes well for the future.

The U13 Boys came up against Robina in the first game and finished 3 – 2 to progress to the second round, but then lost to a well drilled Kimberly College.

Finally, the U15 Boys came from a 3 goal deficit in the first game to record a thrilling victory in the final seconds. The boys then progressed past their next opponent in convincing fashion before being beaten in the Quarter Final round. Fortunately the boys have progressed to the Champion of Champions Round to be held in Term 3.



Adopting a Growth Mindset

Put simply a growth mindset is the belief that intelligence can be developed. At WestMAC we encourage our students to adopt a growth mindset because this will assist them to understand they can increase their ability in a subject through hard work, the use of effective strategies, and by seeking help from others when needed. Someone who has a fixed mindset believes intelligence is a fixed trait that is set in stone at birth.

Students' beliefs about intelligence have important consequences for how they experience school and respond to adversity. A student who has a fixed mindset can find school threatening because they are worried about proving their ability. This can lead to the student avoiding challenges and giving up too soon. On the other hand, a student with a growth mindset

can see school as an opportunity for growth and embraces challenges in order to develop mastery.

Daily interactions parents and teachers have with students can create a mindset which can either support or undermine resilience. A simple strategy adults can use is praising the process students have undertaken as opposed to their ability or the final outcome. For example: "You are good at Maths; you got an A on your last test" very much focuses on the ability of the student. Alternatively, "You really studied for your Maths test and your improvement shows it" praises the process, develops a growth mindset and promotes resilience.

As you read your son or daughter's Term 1 Report, we encourage you to be mindful of the effort and process your young person/people have put in this Term; and offer praise accordingly.

Additionally, students engaged in various workshops, including exploring emotional and physical control, and strategies to maintain their health and emotional wellbeing. Equally important, workshops catered for faith and physical exercise, each playing a vital part in a balanced and positive self. At the end of the day, each student participated in a reflection, developed an action plan highlighting not only information learnt from the day, but also a document that they will open at a later date to reflect their success of maintaining positivity in their life.

It is my hope that although the incursion is only one day in length, the lessons learnt will help build a positive environment for the Middle School across the years. In partnership with you, I hope that this day provides opportunities for your family and friends to discuss the importance of self-reflection and developing positive strategies in our busy everyday lives.
