Service Learning

WestMAC recognises the importance of serving others as part of the education of our young people. In fact, the Senior School Philosophical Statement makes explicit reference to the notion of fostering servant-leadership in our students.

Some of the recognised benefits of service are:

- assists in building confidence, resilience and respect
- teaches compassion, empathy and tolerance
- can lead to increased academic outcomes due to the sense of connectedness with the community
- significant contributor to happiness.

Further, Anglican dioceses throughout Australia believe Anglican schools should participate in God's call to serve the world.

Consequently, students in Years 10 and 11 are required to complete a minimum of seven hours of service per semester. There is a document within the Student Portal that needs to be filled out once the students have completed their required hours, and submitted to their House Coordinator. Where possible, the students are encouraged to complete their Semester 1 hours, and submit their paperwork, during Week 7 of this term. If you have any queries or concerns with regards the College expectations please make contact with your child's House Coordinator.

Importantly, students in Year 11 wishing to apply for leadership positions in 2019 are expected to have completed, or be well on the way to completing, the required service learning hours.

Middle School

Welcome back to Term 2. It has been lovely to see the students return to Middle School refreshed and ready for another big term.

Over the holiday break you were provided with your child's interim report, highlighting both their academic results and their engagement in learning. I hope this provided a useful tool to reflect on their progress thus far and acted as stimulus for conversations at our recent parent/teacher interviews. If you didn't manage to attend the interviews, I encourage you to do

so when this is available at the beginning of Term 3. It is a very beneficial experience and should be attended by both parents and students.

Our Middle School Leadership Team is currently exploring the educational data across the Middle School years to identify patterns in both academic success and engagement with learning (which reflects student effort). We are able to identify patterns and as a result, provide processes that support student success. If you haven't done so already, I encourage you to reflect on these results and praise the success in certain areas with your child as well as provide constructive feedback in others. When speaking with students in the Middle School, we talk a lot about learning and not just results. For teachers, we expect our students to challenge and extend their ways of thinking and learning, rather than just learning what's on the test. Simply, we want higher-order thinking. This risk-taking in their academics may result in learning that is often messy and unfamiliar however, will empower students to take charge of their learning and provide multiple opportunities for success.

When speaking with the students, I've asked them to identify their level of effort at the College. That is, we all engage in things we enjoy however, what effort do we put in those areas that we find challenging or unfamiliar? I encourage you to continue this conversation about your child's effort at the College. This can firstly be raised through the context of their learning in the classroom. Are they going beyond what is expected of them? When learning becomes difficult do they have a closed mindset or do they have a curious and enquiring mind that overcomes such challenges? Furthermore, outside of the classroom what effort are they putting into developing and maintaining positive relationships with both their peers and staff. Finally, what effort are they putting into their commitment to sport and extra-curricular activities? Are they challenging themselves by engaging in something out of their comfort zone and as a result, connecting with a whole group of people that they normally wouldn't otherwise? Such questions support our Middle School Philosophy that sees our students pursuing individual excellence.
