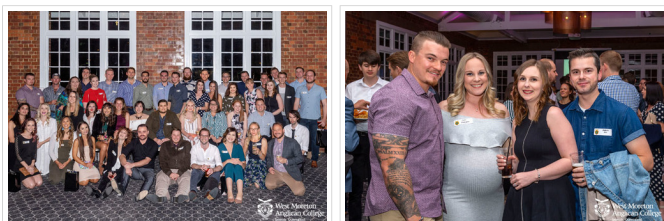

The value of these competitions is not in obtaining a place

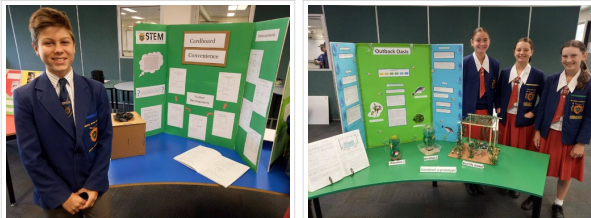

QCAA describes the importance of STEM as a part of everyday life and an increasing part of every workplace. STEM education enables students to develop solutions to complex problems and provides them with literacies and capabilities that will help them succeed in a world of technological change. As future innovators, educators, researchers and leaders, it is important that students develop the skills required to compete on a global scale.

Additionally, engaging in STEM and Engineering related activities benefits students by providing them with:

- a deeper understanding of STEM and Engineering disciplines
- 21st century skills, e.g. collaboration, critical thinking, creativity and problem solving
- STEM literacy for everyday use
- knowledge and confidence to learn.

I congratulate all of our budding STEM and Engineer experts. They represented the College with great enthusiasm and dedication. Special congratulations must go to our Year 7s who won 1st, 2nd and 3rd places for scientific investigation and our Year 9s won 3rd place for model making. A fantastic effort for our first time in this competition and my congratulations to all involved.

Parents can help children to foster a growth mindset by encouraging effort and persistence. Experiencing disappointment is a completely normal part of life. The key is to take disappointment and frame it positively. This can be achieved by having a growth mindset. Some helpful phrases that promote a growth mindset include:

- My effort and attitude determine everything I can do
- I can always grow and learn
- I can train my brain
- Mistakes make me better
- I keep growing my brain by trying new things
- Instead of giving up, I try a different way
- I can't do this ... YET!
- I need to re-think this and not give up.

## Curriculum

## QCST

The Year 12 QCST will be held on Tuesday 4 September and Wednesday 5 September. Students are now on their final round of preparation. Most have now completed their calculator check and have received the equipment list and other instructions.

## Year 12 End of Year Processes

Once Year 12 students have completed all assessments for the year, students are ranked based on their academic achievement, in each Authority Subject. This ranking allows Subject Achievement Indicators, or SAIs, to be calculated. The SAI provides an idea of the student's placement in the subject cohort.

Schools are required to publish SAIs for Year 12 students no later than Wednesday 21 November 2018. WestMAC makes these SAIs available in the library for students to see. Students may choose to return to the College to view these.

Please note that we are not able to give a student's SAI listing over the phone. The SAI must be viewed with respect to the placement of other students in the cohort.

I also draw your attention to the point that Year 12 students are required to be in attendance up to and including Friday 16 November. This is a QCAA requirement.

## Presentation to Year 9 Students and Parents

I am sure that most Year 9 students and parents have heard that assessment in Year 11 and 12 is changing. These changes will take effect with our Year 11 cohort in 2019. We will be holding an Information Evening on Monday 17 September for Year 9 students and their parents. A letter inviting you to this event will appear in your inboxes within the next little while.

## Junior School Parent Teacher Interviews

Junior School on Tuesday 18 September from 3.15pm to 8pm.

We will be using The Alpha School System Parent Teacher Interviews (PTI) method, which is accessed by parents through Parent Lounge.

After the interview conference event is opened, parents can book appointment times directly into the appointment schedule via Parent Lounge. The bookings are made online in real-time, hence the parent is aware immediately of what bookings they are able to obtain. This is also a 'first in first served' type method.

Access to interview bookings through Parent Portal will open for Junior School on 7 September from 6am.

If a staff member has no available appointments available you will need to contact the teacher directly to arrange a suitable time to meet.

## TAS Sport Review

This year a review of the TAS sporting program is taking place. Its aim is to review current procedures and processes, explore new possibilities and methods for undertaking TAS sporting programs and investigate new ventures. A link to a survey has been emailed to allow students, parents and staff to have their say. I would encourage everyone to take the time to complete this survey as it will provide valuable feedback. The survey is seeking feedback from the entire WestMAC community, not just those involved in TAS sporting programs currently. We encourage all parents to take part in completing this survey.

## Term 4 Junior TAS Sport – Touch Football and Tennis

Preparation for the Junior TAS Sporting Program in Term 4 is currently underway. The sports on offer for our Years 4 to 6 students are Touch Football and Tennis. The format for the games in Junior TAS Sport for Term 4 is slightly different to previous terms.

Tennis will be played as a five-week season, with games beginning Saturday 20 October and concluding Saturday 17 November. Games will be played on a home and away basis and due to the team format of play, games may last up to three hours. Students will be trialling for Junior TAS Tennis positions. Students gaining positions on the Tennis Team will be experienced or competent tennis players – this is not a 'learn to play' tennis activity. If students are not successful in gaining a position on the Junior TAS Tennis team, we will once again have an Intra-College Tennis program which involves WestMAC students playing internal fixtures against each other, learning how to play Tennis in a fun, semi-competitive environment.

Touch will be played in a carnival format on Saturday mornings over two weeks. The carnivals are scheduled for Saturday 20 October and Saturday 27 October and will once again be held at Ormiston College.

## Representative Sport Trial Information

WestMAC is permitted to enter a limited number of students into a District or Zone trial. Students nominated must display a high proficiency of skills and tactics in the sport. Students would be playing for school and/or club and be one of the best players in their team. District/Zone sport trials are not a participation event, rather the beginning of the representative pathway towards representing Queensland at National Championships. Teams are generally for students turning 12 Years of age and under unless otherwise stated.

Students are asked to nominate for sports they wish to be considered for in the District Sport Expression of Interest form that is available at the Sports Reception. Information about upcoming trials is announced in the Daily Notices so it is imperative that students listen to these notices each day. Students will be selected based on performances in school sporting teams, in consultation with respective coaches, and a judgment on the standard of previous trials and student ability.

### Uniform Issue

The Middle/Senior track jacket can only be worn by students in Years 7 to 12, when wearing a sporting uniform. It cannot be worn with a formal uniform and Junior School students are not allowed to wear the jacket at any time.

### Swimming Uniform Policy

All Prep to Year 12 students must wear the appropriate WestMAC swimming uniform for HPE and REC lessons. Students will not be permitted to swim if they are not in the correct swimming uniform.

The swimming uniform for Prep to Year 12 for HPE (including REC) lessons consists of:

- WestMAC one piece butterfly togs for girls
- WestMAC Speedos or Jammers for boys
- WestMAC sun shirt
- House coloured swimming cap or WestMAC swimming cap (only if a TAS Swimming team member) are compulsory
- WestMAC swim shorts (optional)

Non-WestMAC boy's Speedos and non-WestMAC girl's one piece togs may be worn providing that they cannot be seen under a WestMAC sun shirt (WestMAC swim shorts may also be required to hide the non-WestMAC togs).

Bobby pins and the navy HPE shorts are not allowed to be worn in the pool. Students are strongly advised to wear sunscreen.

The Swimming Uniform Policy does not apply to private swimming lessons conducted at the College Pool.
