QCAA Student Connect Website and Important Dates

Student Connect gives access to a student's learning account and results, as well as information and links to help students explore their future education, training and career pathways. Year 12 students should have already accessed their account using their LUI (Learner Unique Identifier) found on their school ID card. Year 11 and Year 10 students should also access their account to become familiar with the site. Senior Schooling is able to reset a student's account should they be locked out.

Individual QCS Test grades will be published in learning accounts on 14 November. Final Year 12 results, Overall Position (OP) and Field Positions (FPs) will be available in learning accounts the middle of December. Students may wish to ensure they have the correct access to their account.

If a student is studying a VET course or a QCE-recognised course of study, they will be able to see the credits from that course in their account as soon as the course has been completed and their achievement is 'banked' by your learning provider.

At the conclusion of Year 12, students will NOT receive a Report Card or Exit Statement from the school. QCAA posts QCEs, Senior Statements, Statements of Results, QCIA and Tertiary Entrance Statements to Year 12 students on 14 December. QCAA publishes Year 12 results and OPs into student learning accounts on the Student Connect website on 15 December.

Year 12 End of Year Information

End of Year for the Senior Class of 2018

As the end of year is quickly approaching, it is time to start considering the end of school celebrations we hold for our Year 12 students. To ensure all Year 12 students can participate fully in the activities of their last week, it is important that students and their families are reminded of the following information:

Attendance continues to be extremely important; students MUST be in attendance for each school day, all day, until Friday 16 November 2018. If a student must be absent for either a full or part day, she/he must follow normal school procedures with parents/carers informing the school of the details.

All assessment items must be handed in to graduate and attend the graduation ceremony. It is the student's responsibility to

check with her/his teachers and organise for any outstanding items to be handed in before Friday, Week 5, Term 4 (9 November 2018).

All students must be in full attendance for the last week of term. A number of compulsory events are being held in this week. Graduation rehearsal will occur on Thursday, 15 November and attendance is essential for all involved. The graduation ceremony will begin at 8:30am sharp on 16 November, and conclude at approximately 10.30am. Students are expected to be in their full formal uniform to be presented with their graduation certificate on stage. There will be no uniform items available for borrowing. If there are any issues regarding the formal uniform, please contact the YLC Mr Blakeley.

As seating is limited, the number of guests per student will be limited. Additional guests may be invited once numbers are finalised. Students will receive more detailed information closer to the date. Families are reminded that students must be in full, complete formal uniform, including full black leather shoes

Students must continue meeting the school's uniform policy expectations. Although certain items may be getting old and/or faded, students must maintain their dress standard until the very last day. If you have any issues, please contact Mr Blakeley.

Remember, you remain accountable to the school for your behaviour while at school, on the way to and from school, at school functions, and any other time you are in school uniform. Please be particularly aware of the school's rules regarding student cars and driver's licences. Any breach of the school's Responsible Behaviour Plan for Students will be addressed through our usual processes. Please note that the non-representation list is reviewed at the end of each term. Any student who is ineligible for school representation will not be invited to the Formal.

Students attending the Formal are reminded that it is a school organised and supported event. Normal school rules regarding behaviour and conduct, alcohol and drugs, etc apply. Students are not permitted to drive other students to the function. All student attending the formal will be returning to the school by bus and supervised by teachers. Students found to be in breach of school rules will be asked to leave the event.

Formula Student Track Day

On Friday 26 October, Year 12 students studying Certificate II Engineering Pathways - Formula Student in the culmination of two years study, manufacture and construction were given the opportunity to drive and race their Le Mann's Style Race Car.

Students during Year 11 and 12 have spent the class time fabricating, machining and welding the suspension, chassis and all non-drivetrain parts of the race car. Using Formula Students, the Recognised Training Organisation, Learning Management System and North Lakes State College teachers, students have been taught the necessary knowledge and skills to read component plans, access the correct materials and fabricate these components to specification to be used in the car.

During Year 11 students began the process of constructing the Suspension and Chassis and in Year 12 began assembling these components and fitting the drivetrain, motor and electrics. The body of the race car is a one piece fibreglass shell supplied for the program. The school was fortunate enough to have this shell professionally painted by Auto West Paint Supplies giving the car a stand-out paint finish. The students

and staff greatly appreciate the donation of time and materials to support the students.

On Friday, the car was taken to Queensland Raceways Lakeside Circuit for the Time Trial Race. The students were taken through a drivers briefing on the safety procedures required to drive and race on the track throughout the day.

There were some teething issues with the car that teachers and students problem solved to get the car on the track. Once the car was on the track, students that had the RACERS Drivers Licence were able to complete 6 – 10 laps of the circuit before the end of the day.

The staff and students greatly enjoyed the day and the opportunity to see vehicles and teams from other schools participate in this final activity in the course was a fantastic way for the students to successfully complete their Certificate II Engineering Pathways.

We are looking forward to see how next year's Year 12 students fare with the cars they are currently building, bring on 2019 Track Day.





